Kirchentag 2025

At the end of this month, I will be traveling to Hanover, Germany, to take part in Kirchentag 2025. I was blessed to be a part of Kirchentag 2019 in Dortmund, Germany. So, what is Kirchentag?

If you simply look at the name, we find the two German words Kirche and Tag. Germans love to mash two words together to create a new word. In this case "Kirche" is the German word for church and "Tag" means day. So, one could reasonably think this word means Church Day. Well, in some ways that is perhaps correct. Kirchentag is, however, a multi-day festival for church folks.



This festival takes place over five days. Kirchentag is celebrated every two years and gathers tens of thousands of people in a different location. While the people are primarily made up of Germans, international partners are invited to take part in the festival.

The festival features large worship services, smaller devotional services, plenaries, panel discussion, concerts, bible studies, and many other things.

There is a large exhibitor space filled with representatives from various ministry settings from across Germany and beyond.

We help set up the exhibition of the EKD and "work" at various times at the booth. There we meet many people from around the world and try to answer questions about Kirchengemeinschaft (our full communion partnership agreement between the UCC and the EKD).

The UCC delegation is also in charge of planning a Feierabendmahl (Friday evening communion service). Yours truly has been asked to head up the creating and leading of this service in conjunction with the other UCC participants. Our guest preacher for that evening is The Rev. Michael Blair, the General Secretary of the United Church of Canada. This service will take place at St. Petri, Am Lindenhofe 16, Döhren-Wülfel (St. Peter's church in Hanover.) This intense experience means full days of non-stop participation in all things offered at the Kirchentag. It is always a good time to renew and strengthen relationships as well as create new ones.

I'm deeply grateful to my FCC family for their allowing me to attend this festival. As always, I take the gracious presence of FCC into all of these things, and our partners are deeply grateful for your partnership in working together for a just world for all.







Grand Celebration Easter Worship April 20, 10:00 AM

Hand to Hand Youth Mission Food and Hygiene Drive

This summer, the youth and leaders of United Ministry are heading to Cincinnati for a week of service with Washington United Church of Christ. Washington UCC is deeply involved in outreach throughout their neighborhood and the city, including their ministry, Camp Cupboard and Closet—a resource store that provides clothing, household items, hygiene kits, and food for those in need.

As part of our mission work, our team will be organizing a **Food & Hygiene Drive** to support *Camp Cupboard and Closet* and help provide lunches for those experiencing homelessness.

How you can help:

- •Non-perishable food: rice, noodles, boxed side dishes, canned goods, pasta and sauce, peanut butter, canned/pouched tuna, etc.
- •Full-size hygiene products: soap, shampoo, conditioner, tooth-brushes, toothpaste, floss, mouthwash, deodorant, lotion, moist-urizer, lip balm, razors, shaving cream, etc.

UNITED MINISTRY



SOCIAL ACTION CORNER

What do you think when you hear the word "missions"? Are missions about working globally, teaching, helping improve food supply, or providing medical care, or could they include being on the streets of Akron? The Social Action Committee would like to inform the members of our congregation about our support of missions.

In 1972, a young man, David Fair, began a program for troubled youth who were brought into the court. These young people had non-delinquent charges. They were running away from family conflicts/abuse and neglect, This was the beginning of Shelter Care. Their mission statement is: To provide Healing, Re-

store Hope and Recognize the value of young people and families in need.

Today, Shelter Care has five different programs to support troubled youth in our community: Safe Landing, Highlands, Street Outreach, and the Drop-In Center.



Shelter Care was the first program and continues to serve young boys and girls ages 12-18 years in a two-parent home. These children are sent to schools in the area they reside in and are helped with their studies and provided with counseling sessions. Individuals can utilize the program even into a long-term arrangement, extending to high school graduation.

Safe Landing is a short-term care program for youths in a family crisis. The stay is 1-2 weeks and there are up to 12 youths in the home. They receive counseling along with their family.

Highlands started in 2005. This facility was the first Ohio state licensed facility to care for a young mothers and their babies. This home is for those who no longer have a home. Here they are taught how to care for their child. The goal is to provide a stable environment for young mothers to learn and become providers for their children. Once again, counseling is a part of the program. This helps to give the mothers stability and train them for parenthood.

Street Outreach has a team of four counselors who minister to homeless youths. They can drop in for counseling and job training, or talking with a compassionate listener who listens without judgement.

Drop-In Center is a respite care for homeless youth where there is food and snacks, laundry facilities, a shower room, computers, and counseling if requested.

Shelter Care is a private, non-profit service that has ministered to 700-750 residential youths and over 10,000 in non-residential outreach. The next time you think of social action (missions), think of your local community and Shelter Care.


