Ordinary Time

We are now in the church season known as Ordinary Time. There is nothing ordinary about our gracious and extra-ordinary God. Ordinary refers to the ordinal numbers by which the Sundays following Pentecost are numbered. This season will end on the Reign of Christ Sunday (the last Sunday before the Advent season begins).

The Church chose the color green to be associated with Ordinary Time. In the early Church, new converts to the faith were baptized and took their first communion at the Easter

Vigil. Following the Easter season, the new converts continued to grow in their faith.

In the fall, we will again be holding a series of New Members classes. Prospective members will hear about the history of the UCC, First Congregational Church of Tallmadge UCC, and begin to understand how we carry out ministry in our context here in Tallmadge and beyond.





May 2025 operating income of \$22,550 was \$10,200 below the monthly income need. Operating expenses for the month were \$34,735 resulting in a **deficit** of (\$12,184) in May, and a YTD surplus of \$8,780. And we look forward in prayer to a theology of generosity and the ability to strengthen the growth of our ministries as we move through the year.
