This poem just came across my desk in a daily email I receive:



## MONTHLY FINANCIALS





August 2025 operating income of \$34,560 was \$1,810 above the monthly income need. Operating expenses for the month were \$34,322 resulting in a surplus of \$240 in August, and a YTD deficit of (\$14,190). We are hoping to see the summer decline in Faith Offerings rebound in September as we start the fall church season. Expenses were just below budget in August. We look forward in prayer to a theology of generosity and the ability to strengthen the growth of our ministries as we move through the year. #### "WE GATHER TOGETHER"

#### FCC Stewardship Campaign 2025

In the UCC in general has turned from speaking about stewardship and toward speaking about philanthropy and generosity. While it may feel merely semantics but I choose to see it otherwise. Consider this from Christian Smith's definition from his work with the Generosity Project at Notre Dame University

"Generosity is the virtue of giving good things to others freely and abundantly. It is a learned character trait that involves attitude and action entailing both the inclination and actual practice of giving liberally. It is not a haphazard behavior but a basic orientation to life. What generosity gives can vary: money, possessions, time, attention, aid, encouragement, and more but it always intends to enhance the true wellbeing of the receiver. Like all virtues, generosity is in people's genuine enlightened self-interest to learn and practice."



This definition calls us to move from the one four-week time of focusing on a stewardship campaign to making generosity a "basic orientation to life." It also reminds us that stewardship is not just a money issue. As a short list of "other" things that could be "stewardship" Smith says is, "possessions, time, attention, aid, encouragement."

For example, one week has 168 hours. What would "tithing" on those hours look like? If we went with the biblical tithing model, ten percent would be around 16 hours. Where would you give those 16 hours in service to the gospel? Would you dare come to your minister and say, "I'm giving you 16 hours, what can I do for you?" I don't see you beating a path to my door, but I would ask you to explore other ways that your "generosity" can go beyond just what you put on your pledge card!

#### **WORLD COMMUNION SUNDAY**

The first Sunday of October we celebrate World Communion Sunday. World Communion Sunday (originally called World Wide Communion Sunday) originated in the Presbyterian Church (USA). In 1936, for the first time, the first Sunday in October was celebrated in Presbyterian churches in the United States and overseas. From the beginning, it was planned so that other denominations could make use of it, and after a few years, the idea spread beyond the Presbyterian Church. The Department of Evange-



lism of the Federal Council of Churches (a predecessor body of the National Council of Churches) was first associated with World Wide Communion Sunday in 1940 when the department's executive secretary, Jesse Bader, led in its extension to a number of churches throughout the world. Today, this special observance has taken on a new relevancy and depth of meaning in a world where globalization often has undermined peace and justice—and in a time when fear divides the peoples of God's earth. On this day, we celebrate our oneness in Christ in the midst of the world we are called to serve—a world evermore in need of peacemaking. Come prepared to receive the gifts of the table from God who makes us one!!!


#### **Duties:**

Confirmation will be also be meeting this year after worship. This is for students 8th grade and older who would like to learn more about our church, our history, the traditions and the foundations of our faith.




#### **WORSHIP ART MINISTRY (WAM)**
