



December 2025 operating income of \$65,606 was \$33,095 **above** the monthly income need. Operating expenses for the month were \$38,834 resulting in a **surplus** of \$26,772 in December. Faith Offerings in December were close to the budgeted amount but were buoyed by contributions from our Endowment Fund and a grant that was greater than anticipated. We continue to hope for a strong 2026 and a reduced need for “outside” funds. We look forward in prayer to a theology of generosity and the ability to strengthen the growth of our ministries as we move through the year.
