¹⁴ 'You are the light of the world. A city built on a hill cannot be hidden.¹⁵ No one after lighting a lamp puts it under the bushel basket, but on the lampstand, and it gives light to all in the house. ¹⁶In the same way, let your light shine before others, so that they may see your good works and give glory to your Father in heaven.


WINTER BOOK STUDY | WEDNESDAYS, 12PM, BEGINNING, JAN. 14
