Jesus says in Matthew 6:21, "For where your treasure is, there your heart will be also." It is a familiar verse, but during stewardship season, it invites us to consider an important question: Where are our hearts?

Stewardship is sometimes reduced to budgets, pledge cards, and keeping the lights on. Those things matter. Churches have buildings to maintain, staff to support, programs to fund, and ministries to sustain. But stewardship in the United Church of Christ in general, and at First Congregational Church of Tallmadge in particular, is ultimately about something much deeper. It is about deciding what kind of church—and what kind of world—we want to help create. Every time we give, we make a statement about what matters.



When we support our church, we say that extravagant welcome matters. We believe there should be places where people can walk through the doors and discover that whoever they are and wherever they are on life's journey, they are welcome.

We say that justice matters. Our resources help us stand alongside people whose voices have been ignored, challenge systems that diminish human dignity, and work toward the beloved community Jesus envisioned.

We say that community matters. In an increasingly fractured and isolated society, the church continues bringing people together across differences to worship, learn, serve, laugh, grieve, celebrate, and care for one another.

And we say that hope matters. Every gift supports ministries proclaiming that cynicism does not have the final word, injustice is not inevitable, and God is still creating possibilities for healing and transformation.

This is why stewardship is not primarily about what the church wants from us. It is about what God can accomplish through us. It's about making God the foundation of everyday living!

Jesus understood something profound about money and possessions. Our treasure does not simply follow our hearts; our hearts often follow our treasure. When we invest ourselves generously in compassion, justice, community, and love, those values take deeper root within us.

So perhaps our stewardship question this year should not simply be, "How much can I give?"

Perhaps we should ask:

What do I treasure?

What kind of church do I want us to become?

What kind of world do I want to leave behind?

Then let us place our treasure there.

Because where our treasure is, our hearts will surely follow.

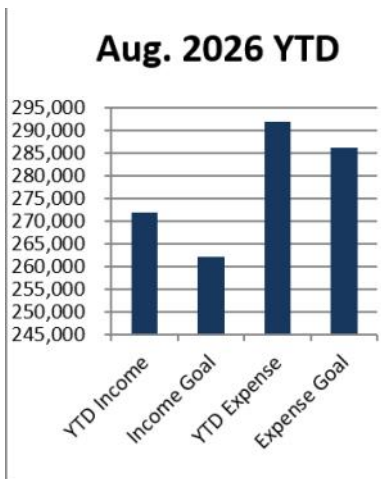
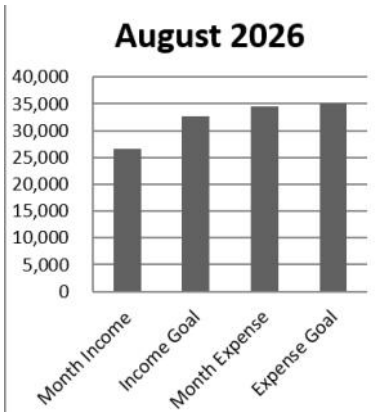
Honoring The Rev. Dr. John Schluep

MONTHLY FINANCIALS



August 2026 operating income of \$26,644 was \$6,100 **below** the monthly income need. Operating expenses for the month were \$34,567 resulting in a **deficit** of (\$7,925) in August, and a YTD deficit of (\$19,965). Faith Offerings have run low all summer while we have had extra expenses this year. We continue to hope for a strong 2026 as we move toward the fall season in September, with new and growing ministries, and we look forward in prayer to a theology of generosity and the ability to strengthen the growth of our ministries as we move through the year. Advocating for Change– Neighbors in Need Special Offering

In 1999, General Synod affirmed four Special Mission Offerings for the United Church of Christ. Out of the four, the Neighbors in Need offering was highlighted as the offering for justice and compassion. The offering was tasked to help the church “advocate for a society where all people have a voice in the decisions that affect their lives.” Today, this legacy continues as we follow the mandate for the offering to create justice not only through direct aid, but also through advocating for change. These advocacy efforts take place in partnership with the Washington, D.C., Office of Public Policy and Advocacy, the Education for Faithful Action Team, and recipients of the Neighbors in Need grants. Together, folks across the UCC work together to affect policy change guided by our faith. When you give to Neighbors in Need, you make sure the United Church of Christ continues to be a leader for justice. 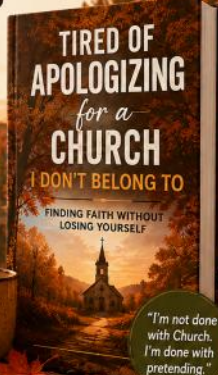

CROP Walk

CROP Hunger Walks are community-led interfaith events that raise funds to end hunger locally and around the world. Participation impacts individuals and families in more than 35 countries.

In many developing nations, people could walk up to six miles a day to get food and water. One in nine people worldwide lack access to clean water and a healthy diet. We walk to show solidarity and to bring awareness while raising funds for permanent change.

From its birth in 1969, CWS-sponsored CROP Hunger Walks have grown to include walkers of all ages, faiths and backgrounds in more than 500 communities throughout the U.S. The CROP Hunger Walk is the only nationwide walk that addresses hunger both locally and globally.

Our Newsletter Is Changing

As good stewards of both our financial resources and God's creation, we are making an important change to our church newsletter. Beginning soon, our traditional printed monthly newsletter will transition to a quarterly online publication. We anticipate making this change beginning in the first quarter of 2027.

This change will provide significant savings by reducing postage expenses, paper use, and copier and printer costs. It is also an environmentally responsible step, helping us use fewer resources while continuing to keep our congregation informed and connected. The proposed deadlines for each of the 2027 editions is:

- December 12, 2026 – Winter 2027
(covering January, February, and March)
- March 11, 2027 – Spring 2027
(covering April, May, and June)
- June 10, 2027 – Summer 2027
(covering July, August, and September)
- September 9, 2027 – Fall 2027
(covering October, November, and December)



The quarterly newsletter will be easy to find. Each new edition will be posted on our church website and all our social media feeds, and a link will be included in our weekly Saturday email blast.

We also recognize that not everyone has convenient access to electronic communication. No one will be left out. A limited number of printed copies will remain available, and newsletters can be mailed to those who need them. New format—same church family, staying connected!
